After graduating college she started teaching in the St. Louis School District, where she retired after many years of service. Hayden and Alice were partial owners of the Troy Free Press for many years. Mrs. Foster was very active in various organizations in her community. She was a member of the Daughters of American Revolution, she joined in 1976, has held various offices including Troy Chapter Vice Regent 1982-1984, Troy Chapter Regent 1984-1986 and secretary for a number of years. She was currently serving as the Troy Chapter Chairman of the DAR Services for Veterans Committee and also the Troy Chapter Chairman of the Missouri Room in Continental Hall. She was also a member of the First Christian Church, Christian Women Fellowship, and Retired Teachers Association and served as secretary for a number of years in Lincoln County. Alice also belonged to the National Society of Magna Charta Dames & Barons, Democratic Club, Troy Literary Club Keystone Sunday School Member,

Sulphur Lick Cemetery Association, where she served as secretary for a number of years and was nominated Volunteer of the Year by OATS in 1998. When Alice was not busy volunteering her time to the local organizations, she enjoyed picking berries, tending her flower garden and spending time with Hayden, fishing and traveling, her favorite trip was to Europe. Her hard work and dedication will be deeply missed by many.
