Aloha “Faye” (Crouch) LaRue, 87, of Troy, Missouri, surrounded by family, passed away peacefully and went home to be with the Lord on Tuesday, October 17, at Lincoln County Nursing and Rehab in Troy, Missouri. Born in Troy, Missouri, On January 7, 1930, Faye was the daughter of the late Fred C. and Mary (Brown) Crouch. Faye married the love of her life, the late Kenneth L.
