Karen Slaven-Reynolds, 66, of Winfield, Missouri, passed away on Friday, April 28, 2023 at Mercy Hospital Lincoln in Troy, Missouri. I also remember going to the farm and meeting her parents. In fact I still have a copy of “Mrs Slaven’s Casserole” in my recipe box that her mother happily shared with me.

Also one time, along with my husband Alan, we drove down to Carbondale just so I could go to a Jeff Beck concert (I was such a fan). We spent the night on the floor of her brother Kevin’s dorm room. Happy days for sure.

Karen was a brilliant, compassionate woman with poignant insights into people and the social welfare of others. She worked tirelessly to help and care for those around her. She was a natural. A nurturer, a true social worker to the core.

Our friendship, although fairly short...was so full, had such depth, and was so full of fun...it had more of everything than most friendships experience in a lifetime. It was definitely meant to be.

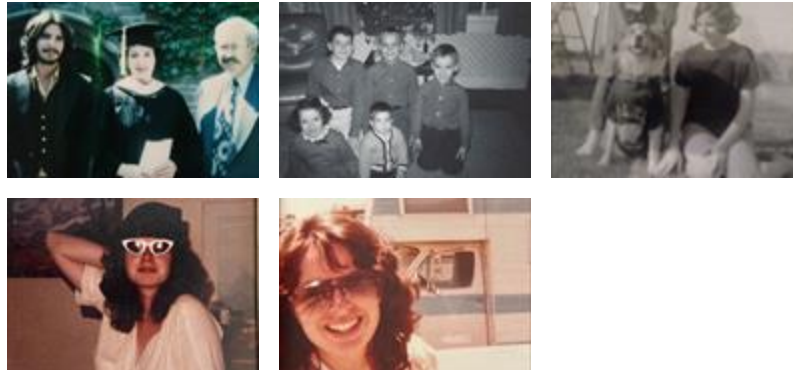
