Larry G. Allen, 73, of Troy, Missouri, passed away on Tuesday, January 5, 2016 at St. Joseph Hospital West in Lake Saint Louis. He was born on December 3, 1942 in Pollard, Arkansas a son of the late Denver R. and Leoma Allen. He was united in marriage to Karen Dunlap in June of 1963 in Pollard, Arkansas and she preceded him in death.

Larry graduated high school and entered the U.S. Army on December 28, 1959 in St. Louis, MO.
