



Martin "Marty" Ferguson Everett

April 27, 1981 - July 27, 2025

Martin (Marty) Ferguson Everett, 44, left this life on July 27, 2025, following a short illness. Marty served in the United States Marine Corps with the Third Battalion, Fourth Marines, also known as "The Thundering Third", from 2000 to 2004. In 2003, he was deployed to Kuwait during Operation Iraqi Freedom. The Third Battalion, Fourth Marines successfully made their way to Baghdad and helped the people of Iraq bring down the statue of Saddam Hussain. When Marty returned to 29 Palms where he was stationed in the States, he was awarded a Purple Heart for injuries sustained during OIF, along with the Combat Action Ribbon, Sea Service Deployment Ribbon (with one cluster), the National Defense Service Medal, the Presidential Unit Citation, Letter of Appreciation, Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (w/combat V). After his service in the Marine Corps, he entered the Police Academy in St. Charles, MO, and after graduating from the police academy, served with the Lincoln County Sheriff's Department and the St. Ann, MO Police Department.

Marty leaves his wife of 23 years, Tinamarie and his daughter, Kaydence Day. He is also survived by his mother, Sherry (Gregg) Daugherty, his father, Robert Everett, his sister, Sarah Fox, his brother, Sean (Gladys) Everett, , his niece, Kaiya and nephew, Ezra, his mother-in-law Anna Lynn and father-in-law, Robert "Bobby" Lynn, his aunts, uncles, cousins and friends, as well as his beloved dogs, Piper and Eve. He was preceded in death by his grandparents.

“Everett and I were working together for Gunny (at the time) Courville, in Bridgeport, Ca. He was the Humvee driver and I was his A driver. We had a Gen 1 Hummer that was repurposed and painted all OD green, I mean everything.

Driving around, up and down the mountain it would overheat intermittently. So one of the trips down we stopped at Motor T and asked one of the mechanics what we should do. The mechanic gave us a 5 gallon Jerry can of water, tilted the hood and said “put the water in here next time it does that.” We both watched him point to the radiator looking type cap where he said to fill it, we responded, “Roger that” and went on with our business. A few hours later sure enough on the way down it overheated, so we said let’s just go to the Motor Pool and they can take care of it. Sure enough when we pulled in no one was there. So we decided to add the water ourselves and carry on. I tilted the hood, he jumped up on the tire opened the cap, I handed him the Jerry can of water and he commenced to filling up the “cooling” system. Well, it took the whole 5 gallons. He said Dedmon we need more, so I walked over to where the mechanic grabbed the Jerry can, grabbed one, handed it to him, and he started to topping off the water again.

By the way before I enlisted I worked on vehicles at a Nationwide chain. So I was somewhat familiar with vehicle systems, but clueless to Hummers and theirs.

About half way through the second Jerry can I said stop man this isn’t right, there is no way this thing takes 5 plus gallons of coolant. We looked at each other in disbelief, how is this possible? We double checked each other and confirmed that the mechanic told us right here, where we were filling it up at. We were lost!!

Well then I decided to pull the oil dipstick and sure as anything 7+ gallons of water were dumped in the crankcase! We both were stunned, saying He told us right here!! What’s the deal. All this being said if someone has not seen under the hood of a military Gen one Hummer, that everything was painted green, they would understand our situation. As well as the fact that there were coolant type caps all over the engine bay. Like the one we opened to put water in. Just so happened this one was one of the ones for oil.

We never started it back up, waited till a mechanic came back, told him the situation, he was in disbelief as well. So all three of us got underneath it as he unscrewed the drain plug. Let's just say we watched for like 3 minutes as the water flowed out, until the oil finally came. Back then all we had were those disposable cameras, I did take pictures of this incident, the water portion, but I lost the camera at some point. Needless to say we drained all the oil and WATER, put fresh "oil" in and nothing ever came from it. I've told this story numerous times and I laugh every time. Thanks for the memories Brother!!!
